Panel 4. Judicial Speeches and Public Policy

In the discussion on the challenges of Justice in the 21st century, one of the themes that permeates research agendas is the distribution of justice, the strengthening of democratic spaces and the realization of fundamental rights and guarantees. Considering this perspective, the purpose of this panel is to discuss how decisions handed down within the framework of the Judiciary impact on the design of public policy. Thus, understanding the links between legislative drafting and its repercussion on judicial decision-making is the key objective of this panel. The reflections of this panel intend to lead to the construction of investigations in which the attention given to the argumentative formulation of the judicial decisions can be articulated with observation of the legislative elaboration, deepening the studies on the balance dimensions of the public powers and the possibilities for the democracy. To this end, the panel is organized from the following sub-themes:

- a) Judicial decision-making processes and how their logic can impact public policies;
- b) Legislative speeches and their connection with judicial decisions;
- c) Regulatory impact and judicial decisions.
